

The Art of Consultation on 'the Organisational Stage'

Consultation is an art requiring an understanding of the role systems of the organisations and a competent role repertoire. The purpose of the workshop is to develop participants' ability to investigate and influence relationships and activity on various organisational stages using *Action methods* as tools. *Action methods* are a collection of creative training tools. They are used to increase creativity and action-ability, to make visible, to map/chart, and – in real life, in real time – examine and influence the complexity of our roles and the role systems of the organisation. During this workshop, we will highlight in action the art of consultation, the consultation process and the role requirements of the consultant.
